GIANT BUBBLE MIX RECIPE (as seen on Whānau Fun Night)

INGREDIENTS:

- WATER 1.5 litre / 6 cups
- DETERGENT 125mls / ½ cup (The brand can make or break the recipe. UK Fairy Liquid is best, but the most readily available next best is Palmolive Original Dishwasing Liquid.)
- GUAR GUM POWDER 1/2 slightly heaping teaspoon (this
 is a natural food thickener and can be found at health
 food stores / bulk bin shops and some Pak n Saves)
- BAKING POWDER 1 tbsp.
- GLYCERINE 1 tbsp

METHOD:

- 1. Mix all the ingredients together in a bucket / large bowl.
- 2. Rest the mixture for at least 24 hours (optional but recommended). Occasional stirring during the rest period can help make sure all ingredients dissolve together.
